

This document shows what keys of the font Tengwar Annatar Alt by Johan Winge can be accessed from non-unicode macintosh applications (when the U.S. keyboard is chosen). For what I know, these applications can't access any other keys. I can't explain why. The little blue signs show the same keys in font Times.

Note that in a unicode-applications, the keymappings shown below don't work. That is, in the font Times they are identical, but they are different in the font Tengwar Annatar Alt, which is a complete mystery to me. That is why the above chart is **only for non-unicode applications** (such as AppleWorks 6, BBedit lite, Word for Mac), whereas it's different in unicode applications (such as TextEdit, Key Caps).
